Civic Hall Covid-19 Vaccination Centre. A Message from the Middlewood Partnership

Thank you for your patience over the last few weeks regarding the COVID vaccination programme. We are delighted to confirm that we have received confirmation of our status as a COVID vaccination site and are now in a position to let you know how the national vaccination programme will be implemented for our registered patients at Middlewood.

How will the roll out work?

Based on national criteria we will start vaccinating:

• Care home residents and the staff from Monday 18th January

• Middlewood registered patients who are over 80 on Friday 15th and Saturday 16th of January

Where will I have to go to get my vaccination?

• At this time all vaccinations (except for care homes) will take place at Poynton Civic Hall. Directions can be found at http://www.poyntontowncouncil.gov.uk/contact.htm

How will I get my appointment?

• You will either receive a text message or a telephone call inviting you to attend the clinic. The text message will ask you to click on a link taking you directly to the booking system to book your appointment.

• If we do not have a mobile phone number registered on our system for you we will telephone you and book the appointment directly with you.

• You may be asked to attend clinics at very short notice. Please try to attend.

• There will be a telephone number for you to contact with queries relating to the vaccine. This will only be for vaccination questions and we will not be able to answer questions relating to anything else

• Please **DO NOT** contact our main receptions at any practice base about questions relating to COVID vaccination appointments. They will not have any information available about this.

In light of the latest Government guidance on 4th January 2021, Poynton Town Council will be keeping the two play areas it maintains open. However, it is against the law to meet socially with family or friends unless they are part of your household or support bubble.

Please adhere to social distancing and sanitising guidelines and observe the maximum occupancy of the play areas, as displayed on the park gates.

Covid-19 scams

Action Fraud have received reports from members of the public who have been sent text messages claiming to be from the NHS, offering them the opportunity to sign up for coronavirus vaccinations. The texts ask the recipient to click on a link which takes them to an online form where they are prompted to input personal and financial details. In some cases the online form has looked very similar to the real NHS website.

How to protect yourself:

In the UK, coronavirus vaccinations will only be available via the National Health Services of England, Northern Ireland, Wales and Scotland. You can be contacted by the NHS, your employer, a local GP surgery or pharmacy, to receive your vaccination. **Remember, the vaccinations are free of charge and you will not be asked for a payment.**

The NHS will never:

- ask for your bank account or card details
- ask for your PIN or banking passwords
- arrive unannounced at your home to administer the vaccine
- ask for documentation to prove your identity, such as a passport or utility bills

If you receive a call you believe to be fraudulent, hang up. If you are suspicious about an email you have received, forward it to <u>report@phishing.gov.uk</u>. Suspicious text messages should be forwarded to the number 7726, which is free of charge.
