Poynton Town Council employs a team of Council Community Support Officers. These positions will be a visible uniformed presence and will have accredited powers of enforcement.

You'll usually work 37 hours a week on day and evening shifts, including weekends and bank holidays. Shifts usually cover the hours between 8am and midnight.

You'll mostly be outdoors, patrolling residential areas on foot or bike. You may also work indoors, for example when giving talks to community groups and schools. You'll be provided with a uniform. The post is subject to Police and DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) vetting.

Flu Vaccination campaign 2020

For Middlewood Partnership, this year's flu vaccination campaign is going to be a significant challenge, given that up to two thirds of their patient population will be eligible for a flu vaccine. This includes everyone over the age of 50 for the first time, which means alternative premises are required to facilitate social distancing and specific arrangements are being made.

Patients will be invited to attend a specific time slot and households invited as a group. Face coverings must be worn by both staff and patients.

Patients will receive either a text message or letter advising of their appointment.

Know your numbers! Check your blood pressure!

This year's theme for Know Your Numbers Week is "YOU are in control". High blood pressure, rarely has noticeable symptoms and if untreated, increases the risk of health problems such as heart attacks, dementia and strokes. Council Community Support Team News

NO MORE RUBBISH EXCUSES!

Due to weather conditions and wilful damage of anti-litter campaign signs, the Council Community Support Team have replaced them with more substantial ones.

The CCST urge people to adhere to littering laws and keep Poynton free from litter. Littering is an offence for which you can receive a fixed penalty charge of up to £80.

The CCST have made contact with all local schools to wish them well in their new term and offer any assistance they may require in the coming months. The Team have also arranged several educational talks to be delivered to local primary schools.

The CCST have also dealt with a case of fly tipping. Fly tipping is a criminal offence and can in some cases be punishable with fines up to £50,000 or imprisonment.



Moggie Lane Bridge update

Much of the reconstruction is now complete. Cheshire East Highways are in the process of rebuild the bridge wall which is partially finished. There are minor bits of surfacing booked in for next week. Some ongoing works are required in the gardens adjacent to the site. This will still require traffic lights for short periods. Cheshire East Highways say they aim to be completely off site within the next 4 weeks.



Works to watercourse, Glastonbury Drive

Cheshire East will be carrying out essential works to the watercourse on Glastonbury Drive to reduce the risk of future flooding in this area. The work will commence on the 5th October 2020. Full details of the work can be found [here](#).
