Waste Recycling Centres Consultation

Cheshire East Council has begun its consultation on household waste recycling centres. The council currently runs eight household waste recycling centres (HWRCs) for use by residents. The contract for this operation ends in 2023 and Cheshire East are consulting on what should happen at the end of the contract.



All of the scenarios being considered (except for the status quo) would result in the closure of the

Poynton site. The Town Council is extremely concerned that closure of the Poynton site would result in reduced levels of recycling, increased fly tipping, and increased car journeys which will be detrimental to air quality.


Follow a star
