Reopening the Civic Hall

Polling Station Changes - 6th May

The Police and Crime Commissioner election is taking place on Thursday 6th May 2021. However, due to the pandemic, a number of our usual polling station venues are not available and Cheshire East have made changes to the locations where some electors will vote.

The following polling station in Poynton are changing Lostock Hall School to St George's Church and Worth Primary to Poynton Workmen's Club. Details of the new venues will be carried on the polling cards which will be distributed from the 25th March.

N.B. If it has a green spot, Cheshire East have been notified that the grid needs attention.

Council Community Support Team (CCST) news

This week the CCST are delivering 'Stranger Danger' talks to the children at The Hollies pre-school. The Team will be passing on key messages to the children to make them aware of strangers they can trust such as police officers and those they can't.

The CCST continue to deliver 'Scam Awareness' material to vulnerable people in Poynton who have reported incidents of nuisance phone calls and scam emails. The Team are working closely with Age UK and Cheshire East Council on this topic.



Poynton Relief Road lane closure 26th April

As the Principal Contractor working with Cheshire East Council and Stockport Borough Council on the Poynton Relief Road project, Graham will be imposing traffic management and switching traffic to a temporary single lane carriageway on the north side of Chester Road. The traffic management will commence on Monday 26th April with the installation of 2-way traffic lights to enable service diversions on the north side of Chester Road adjacent to their site. Following the completion of the service diversions, traffic will be switched to a newly constructed temporary single lane carriageway and managed by 2-way traffic lights.

The temporary carriageway will remain in place for approximately 12 months and is essential to facilitate the ongoing construction of the new Chester Road overbridge, including the completion of the wingwalls and abutments.

Graham are aware of the affect traffic disruption has on their neighbours and local community, so will only be imposing the traffic management and the use of the temporary carriageway for as long as is necessary.

Countryside code

The Government have produced a new countryside code. <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/the-countryside-code/the-countryside-code-advice-for-countryside-visitors#follow-signs>.

Residents are reminded to follow the Countryside Code and Respect everyone by:

- being considerate to those living in, working in and enjoying the countryside
- leave gates and property as you find them
- do not block access to gateways or driveways when parking
- be nice, say hello, share the space
- follow local signs and keep to marked paths unless wider access is available



Did you know that a public right of way is just that? The right to travel along the right of way. You are not allowed to stop for any significant length of time. So no picnics. The landowner has the right to either grant or deny cycling/horse riding along a public right of way.

The landowner can also request that you have your dog on a lead whilst on a public right of way. The landowner has the right to shoot dogs if they are running loose amongst livestock.

Obstructing a public right of way is a criminal offence.


