#### Civic Hall Refurbishment Project — Summer 2022

The Civic Hall was built in the late 1960's and officially opened in 1971. Phase 1 of the refurbishment works were carried out when the library and civic hall merged in 2014-2015, but not all parts of the building were refurbished. Phase 2 is now due.

Surveys have confirmed that some systems have not been updated for more than 50 years and are in need of urgent replacement.

There are issues with: Asbestos - Electrics and electricity supply - Gas installation - Heating & hot water - Health & safety (including fire alarm, emergency lighting) - the roof - drains.

#### Car parking survey

Residents and businesses may have noticed that Britannia Parking on behalf of Waitrose is currently issuing warning notices in the short stay section of the Civic Centre car park, where people are parking for longer than the 2 hours stated. The car park at the Civic Centre is owned by Cheshire East Council but the short stay section is leased to Waitrose.

The Town Council is aware that there is considerable anxiety regarding possible enforcement of the short stay car park and we are currently in the process of assessing how residents and businesses have been impacted. ## New wellbeing card for young people — Keep it safe, just in case!

A successful collaboration supporting young people's mental health.

A pocket-sized 'wellbeing card' for young people in Poynton was launched as part of Mental Health Awareness week, 9-15 May 2022. Created from an idea from members of Poynton High School's Student Leadership Team, the card details services and useful contacts available for young people, to support their mental health and wellbeing. Every student at Poynton High School will be offered a card to keep safe, just in case.



It's been a difficult time for everyone over the last couple of years, no less so than for our young people. The card has been designed by Poynton Town Council, and developed by the Middlewood Partnership, through members of its Poynton-based Patient Participation Forum groups. The Student Leadership Team at Poynton High School had highlighted the need for more information for young people about how and where to seek help and support.




#### £428 raised for Dementia UK

Cheshire East Council is calling on residents across the borough to return loaned equipment like walking frames, crutches, beds, mattresses and hoists when no longer needed.

The equipment is provided usually following a fall, hospital discharge or other situation, and could be reused by another person in the community in need of support.



Reuse of equipment is more environmentally friendly and helps resources to be invested in other health and social care services.

Councillor Jill Rhodes, Cheshire East Council adults and health committee chair, said: "Some of this equipment may only be used when a person is recovering from illness or injury and can end up stored around the home, surplus to requirements.

"Putting back into circulation items that are no longer needed, means we can continue to provide the vital equipment that people need in the timescales required."
