

## **DAVID GOODWIN**

14233, Private, David Goodwin, 10<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Cheshire Regiment.

Born in 1895 at Poynton, Cheshire, son of Arthur and Ann Goodwin, living at 112 Park Lane, Poynton, Cheshire. In 1911, David was working as a colliery horse driver below ground, however, by the time he enlisted he was working as a miner. His siblings were Sarah Jane, Joseph and Arthur.

David attested, 02/09/1914, at Macclesfield and after extensive training he was drafted with the British Expeditionary Force for France, embarking from Folkstone, 26/09/1915. The Cheshire's were in the 25<sup>th</sup> Division, 7<sup>th</sup> Infantry Brigade, and in October 1915 were engaged with the enemy at Ploegsteert. The battalion war diary for October 1915 reads: 18<sup>th</sup> October, TOUQUET BERTHE, working party of 'A' Company shelled with H.E. and shrapnel, 8 men wounded one (Pte Goodwin) since died. David died of wounds on 21/10/1915, surviving less than a month in France. He was aged 20 years.

Medals: 1914/15 Star, British War Medal and Victory Medal.

Private, David Goodwin is buried at Bailleul Communal Cemetery, Nord, France. C.W.G.C, Ref: - I. F. 158.
